PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I would like to begin by acknowledging and thanking Baseball Victoria's key government and corporate partners for their ongoing support in 2004/2005. The Department of Sport and Recreation Victoria, VicHealth, Victorian Institute of Sport, Aces Sporting Club, Major League Baseball, Wilson Sporting Goods and Ausport Superstore contribute to the array of activities and services that Baseball Victoria provides its members and affiliates across the state.

In 2005, Baseball Victoria recognized its previously inducted Life Members at the Annual Awards night in May with the presentation of Life Member plaques. These individuals committed their time and energy over many years to Baseball in Victoria and played an integral role in the development of the sport. Unfortunately, Baseball lost the following Life Members during the year: Colin McKay (inducted 1986), Talbot Hill (1973), Beryl Bunting (2004) and most recently Bob Black (1963). Baseball Victoria did also induct two new Life Members in Grant Weir and Robert Blackmore for their lengthy contributions to game development and umpiring, respectively.

During the 2005 Claxton Shield the ABF held its inaugural Hall of Fame induction dinner where 41 individuals' contribution to the sport was recognized. Nine Victorians were amongst these inaugural inductees in Harry Simpson, Frank Laver, Charlie Puckett, Ross Straw, Don Deeble, Graeme Deany, John Swanson, Phil Dale and Graeme Lloyd. Congratulations to all these individuals and there families.

There is no doubt that Baseball, like many other sports, would not survive without its volunteers. Thank you to everyone that coached, umpired, marked fields, ran the canteen or undertook many of the other important tasks that make a club tick. I would also like to highlight the fantastic contribution made by everyone involved with Baseball Victoria's elite programs, junior and senior, over the past 12 months.

Victoria was again well represented by its state teams in 2005 and congratulations once more go to our Women's team in taking out another National Championship. Also, to all players that earned national team selection, well done.

Victoria's 2005 Claxton Shield campaign saw a drastic reversal of fortune from the previous year

with the team ultimately being outplayed by NSW in the final. Well done to the entire team and David White (Manager) and his support staff for the efforts. Also, to the Victorian's that received Claxton Shield honours in Paul Rutgers (Batting Champion), Simon Beresford (Golden Arm) and the stellar performance of Bradley Harman in taking out the Golden Glove and Helms Award.

I wish to acknowledge the contribution of the Baseball Victoria staff in continuing to provide a professional service to our members and affiliates. We also welcomed Laura Piekarski and Ben Utting during the year and both have proven to have been excellent additions to Baseball Victoria.

The year has provided significant challenges in a number of areas. These include the on-going Playball program as well as financing of all programs. The Playball program (originally funded by the Australian Sports Commission and Major League Baseball) has proved to be an outstanding success in terms of attracting new young players to our sport. The backpacks have proved to be such a great tool to work with that we will continue to provide them when the sponsorship runs out. If there is a business out there that is targeting Tee Ball age children, then we have a number of sponsorship opportunities including the backpacks.

Another junior development area was the commencement of our under 14's girls competition. This is a significant move forward in the on-going viability of Women's baseball. We need to nurture and grow this area.

The other area is the continual need to provide a strong financial base from which to operate. We need to continue to build our cash reserves as well as looking to provide for the future. I find it very sad that for a sport that is over one hundred years old we have no assets. It speaks poorly of the vision of our predecessors that unlike cricket, football etc they were not concerned with providing the strong financial base for the future. We only need to look at the recent history of the ABF to see what prudent investment can do for our sport.

In relation to finances it is still a battle out there for our clubs at all levels. Again Baseball Victoria did its bit by maintaining its fees structure and not increasing its fees. In addition we still provide a significant reward for those clubs that are well







managed in the form of the 20% and 10% discounts for early payment of compulsory team fees. This is a tremendous reward and recognition for good management. However, we still have some clubs that are struggling and need to take a long hard look at themselves in order to improve their management in all forms of the operations especially in the financial areas. We have seen the demise of long standing clubs like Coburg due to poor management - particularly in the area of finances. We need to ensure that this situation improves and this is one of the objectives of the Home Run Club. Baseball Victoria is not the enemy and can be the saviour for Clubs who need assistance. However, they need to bite the bullet and look at themselves and recognize their strengths and in particular their weaknesses. We are here to assist.

In relation to history we are still in need of a heritage committee to start to look at and protect the heritage of baseball in Victoria. We have lost some clubs in the past and with them their history; which is the history of our sport. We need to protect this and look to provide a resource for the future. We also need to commence our own Baseball Victoria Hall of Fame. So if you are looking for something to do in your "spare time" here is an ideal opportunity.

In closing, I wish to thank all clubs and members for their ongoing support and for their role in ensuring that Baseball in Victoria remains a strong and viable sport, available to all Victorians.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

At the conclusion of 2004, it was identified that in order to ensure the ongoing viability for Baseball Victoria that the organisation had to continue to support its members and affiliates to increase membership and promote professionalism throughout all levels of the sport. Reflecting upon 2005, I am confident that Baseball has taken positive steps forward in each of these areas thanks to the board, staff and most importantly the clubs and their volunteers.

All facets of the development of Baseball remain an ongoing focus for Baseball Victoria with the recent reaffirmation by the board of its commitment to this area. A major focus for clubs has been activities conducted through the Playball program. Baseball is reaping the rewards of the efforts associated with this program from the last three years with a documented increase of 35% in junior team numbers in the summer competition since 2002/2003.

Last year, Baseball Victoria introduced its club development program, the Home Run Club. This program is designed to assist clubs with the process of continuous improvement in the areas of governance, volunteers, participation, health and wellbeing and promotion. With feedback from a range of stakeholders following the dissemination of the first level of the program. Baseball Victoria has now developed and commenced rolling-out the Home Run Club in its entirety. Club administrator's can progress through the five levels at their own pace and be confident that every activity undertaken within the program will by 'money in the bank' towards the betterment of their club.

Baseball Victoria and the Victorian Provincial Baseball League made great strides in 2005 towards a unified approach to the statewide administration of Baseball. The joint signing of a Memorandum of Understanding has defined the roles and responsibilities of each organisation and crystallized the efforts of both parties to work harmoniously for the good of Baseball. On the back of this development was the introduction of the concept of a Junior Development Board (JDB) which reports to the board of Baseball Victoria. The JDB is representative of key stakeholders with the objective of driving the strategic direction and vision for the development of junior baseball across the whole of Victoria in both summer and winter.

A real challenge for Baseball at present is the lack of qualified umpires available to officiate competition games. This is an issue that has the capacity to inhibit the future growth of the sport. Fortunately, Victoria has a highly committed group of umpires that are continuing to deliver a range of umpire training courses across the state. Furthermore, with the imminent reformation of the Umpire Focus Group, Baseball Victoria together with club representatives will address this and other issues with the umpires in order to improve this situation for the future.

As we prepare to commence another summer season, we can also look forward to exciting times ahead for Baseball with the introduction of the World Baseball Classic in March 2006 and the potential re-introduction of the National League within the next 2 years.

EXECUTIVE HIGHLIGHTS - DEVELOPMENT, MARKETING & OPERATIONS

DEVELOPMENT:

The Victoria Institute of Sport Baseball Program capped another banner year of training and grooming our top Victorian talent. The program saw 11 U16 & U18 athletes selected to attend the 2004 MLB Academy National Camp, with four U18 players selected to the National team to compete at the U19 World Championships in Taiwan. Three coaches assisted in this camp. Four graduates of the VIS program were selected to the Athens Olympic qualifiers with Andrew Utting & Brett Tamburrino making the final team that won the Silver Medal in Athens.

The VIS program had 16 athletes selected to the Victorian U18 team, one to the U16 state team, and six athletes to the Victoria Provincial U18 team. Both Head Coaches and four assistant coaches in these programs are VIS assistant coaches. The Claxton Shield team had 16 graduates on the side that took second in Blacktown. The program was also proud to add seven more athletes to the professional ranks, taking the total VIS athletes signings to 39. Graduate Justin Huber reached the pinnacle, earning promotion to the Major Leagues with the Kansas City Royals, joining Seattle pitcher Travis Blackley as the second VIS athlete to reach the US Major League. There are currently 21 VIS graduates playing professional baseball in the USA. Finally, the VIS had three athletes take up US College scholarships this year bringing the total to 29 to take up this opportunity. Graduate Daniel Berg was selected in the 2004 US Major League draft and made his professional debut in 2005.

This past year has seen a focus on coaching accreditation. Fully booked sessions were held in Berwick, Geelong, Waverley, Watsonia and Werribee. The school clinic program continues to grow. This past year, over 500 school clinics were conducted and 95 schools visited, up nearly 10%. The Playball program ended its third year of financial support from the Australian Sports Commission. Future funding opportunities are currently being explored for the program that resulted in 768 new player registrations and has exposure to 99000 children.

MARKETING & COMMUNICATIONS:

Baseball Victoria increased their sponsor numbers this year by signing on Ausport Super Store as an all-of-sport sponsor and Preferred Supplier. This partnership was extremely valuable in assisting our VIS Baseball program meet their on-field needs and added commercial clout in an extremely competitive market.

Event sponsorship increased this year by 462%. Bisley Work Wear signed on as the Official Staff & Volunteer Apparel Provider for the Astarra AAA Championship. Additionally, Major League Baseball capital support increased with the addition of three new teams to the fold: Minnesota Twins, Philadelphia Phillies & Toronto Blue Jays, along with return partner Seattle Mariners. continued involvement in the contribution to grassroots sport is vital to achieving the financial objectives of sustaining junior development. Attendance to the AAA's increased by 10%

Media coverage of the sport increased this year, with over \$150K of editorial space provided across all mediums. The support of 24-7 Sport Radio SEN 1116AM was extremely important to increasing the public profile of the sport beyond traditional baseball supporters. On-air interviews with Justin Huber, Travis Blackley, Glenn Williams, Jon Deeble, and US Hall of Famer Rod Carew were among the highlights. Leader Community News & Fairfax continued to Community News uninterrupted coverage of club competition and remain extremely critical at grass-roots level. The Geelong Advertiser in particular is to be cited for their dedicated coverage of the AAA's in 2005, leading to a weekly radio show on Pulse FM-Geelong covering the Geelong Baseball Association's Winter season.

Traffic to the corporate website increased by an astounding 38%. Feedback from the general baseball community and the dedication to deliver a five-star site for baseball news was credited for the increased traffic. With an audience that spans beyond the boundaries of Australia, we will continue to raise the bar to deliver a world-class website for baseball beyond our Victoria supporter base.

Membership management services and the MyClub system continue to improve. The Competition Management component will be in effect beginning Summer 2005/2006 after a successful trial during the 2005 winter season. Boasting the highest signon rate in Australia, Victoria continues to be the leader in the roll-out of this service and many thanks are offered to all the volunteers who displayed the passion and provided the input into this service.

After last season's drop in team entries, this season saw an extra five (5) Men's teams entered but, unfortunately, a further loss of two (2) Women's teams. The latter was a surprise given the enthusiasm shown at the Women's forum.

This season also was the start of the revamped Men's competition after last season's exhaustive Review. The Committee considers the "new" competition to be a resounding success and expects it to run beyond the initial two (2) seasons suggested in the Review.

Another change this year had the Pennant Committee take over all like responsibilities for Junior Baseball which resulted in Jason Blair joining the Committee as our Junior expert. Jason proved to be a good contributor to all aspects of the Committee's work and we are sure that this move will provide a more consistent view of Pennant matters for all the competition.

The most amazing fact about this season was the record low number of Clearance Appeals since I joined the Committee in 1975 – only one (1) Senior and one (1) junior Appeal came before the Committee. The Clubs are to be congratulated for finally adopting a realistic approach to this vexing subject.

Umpire numbers continue to decline in almost direct proportion to player attitude to our officials. Maybe the message will get through when even Division 1 requires a "Club" umpire.

Women's baseball continues to concern the Committee in that there seems to be little stability in the teams, which is partially understandable considering that marriage, pregnancy etc. affects the participants. However, the attitude of some Clubs to having to win every game in every Division needs to be adjusted. Despite the Women's forum, we still face almost insurmountable problems in keeping a structured competition alive.

Support of the office staff is essential to the Committee and we continue to be served well. Andrew Fennell has grown in his understanding of his role and is a good contributor to all Committee matters. I thank all Committee members for their support and dedication to the Sport we all love.

DIRECTOR OF UMPIRING SEASON REPORT

Firstly let me offer my congratulations and appreciation to the playing community for the attitude towards the umpires who worked during the 2004/05 season. After the previous season, a request was made for tolerance and understanding due to heavy losses in umpire ranks which lead to some umpires working games that may have been above their current skill level. This appeal was accepted by most participants in our sport and I thank them for it.

There remains, however, the small minority in our game, usually spectators with nothing better to do, who believe that umpires are "fair game" when on the field and continue to harass young umpires trying their best just to get it right. Continued harassment through the game does nothing to enhance an umpire's game concentration but I am ever hopeful that the sport will continue to grow and that these people will eventually see the light so we can all get on with the job at hand.

The pre-season umpires' seminar was held at Waverley Baseball Club and I wish to extend my appreciation to Ross Neilson and the hard working members and players who assisted in making this weekend the success it was, despite the occasional inclement weather. It was attended by some 36 people comprising both current and club umpire students. The 8 instructors, including 2 from interstate, worked hard to ensure that all facets of the training were completely understood by the attendees. Unfortunately there were no additions to the regular umpire panel from those that attended.

Melbourne Baseball Club was the venue for the ten training evenings that were held during the season and, on behalf of the BUAV, I wish to offer my appreciation for the generous use of their facilities and especially to Malcolm Chiverton who was there every time to open and close the clubrooms.

The generous support of clubs such as Waverley and Melbourne are necessary for the umpire training program and foster good relations between players and umpires alike and is much appreciated.

The total number of umpires registered to the VBA panel was 33 but during the regular season the average number of official panel umpires available to work games in the Senior Men's competition on a week by week basis was 24. This is a reduction from last season's weekly average of 34.

The available umpires made a total 1205 game appearances during the season covering a total of

646 of a possible 1174 games, including finals, mid week and master's games, giving a coverage ratio of 55%.

The division 1 and 2 firsts and reserves enjoyed 100% coverage with division 3 at 78% coverage. Other grades were obviously covered at a lower rate due to reduced umpire numbers.

The women's competition was covered by only 7 umpires but they covered 163 of the 245 available games, a coverage rate of 66.5%. Division 1 was covered at a rate of 98.7% with division 2 at 16%.

I also want to acknowledge the umpires who worked the first grade plates during the Grand Finals for this year.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2004

1 **SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The principal accounting policies adopted are stated to assist in a general understanding of these financial statements. These policies have been consistently applied by the Victorian Baseball Association Incorporated ("the Association") except as otherwise indicated.

(a) Basis of Accounting

The financial statements have been prepared on the basis of historical costs and except where stated, do not take into account current valuations of noncurrent assets. The accruals basis of accounting has been adopted.









(b) **Grant Income**

Grants are brought to account in the period they are received. To the extent grants remain unspent at year end, they are carried forward as deferred income.

(c) **Fixed Assets**

Fixed assets are depreciated over their estimated useful lives using the following rates:

Motor Vehicles 22.5% straight line

Office Furniture and Equipment 7.5% - 33% reducing balance

Additions are depreciated from the month of acquisition.

(d) Cash Flows

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, cash is represented by cash on hand and at bank.

Income Tax (e)

The Association has received exemption from income tax pursuant to Section 23(g) of the Australian Income Tax Assessment Act and thus is not liable for any income tax, and accordingly no provision for income tax has been made.

(f) **Employee Benefits**

Benefits for long service leave are provided for in the financial statements once a legal obligation associated with the entitlement exists, which is after ten years.
