Change Our Game Community Activation Grants

We would like to remind our clubs that applications are now open through 5pm on Friday, 25 October for Change Our Game Community Activation Grants. This funding program of the Victorian government provides grants for one-off community events that showcase and celebrate the role of women and girls in sport and active recreation. Grants of up to \$5,000 are available to increase the capacity of community sport and recreation organisations to deliver events that promote gender equality. This funding can be used to highlight women's baseball and encourage female participation in sport, as demonstrated by Doncaster Baseball Club's Baseball and Beyond event in March. We encourage clubs to apply for the Change Our Game grants as this funding could have a great impact on the bright future of women's baseball here in Victoria.
