Victoria Announced as Provisional License Holder for Australian Women's Baseball League

Baseball Victoria is one of four organisations that have been granted provisional licenses for the inaugural season of professional women's baseball league in Australia. Baseball Victoria joins the Adelaide Giants, Brisbane Bandits and Canberra Cavalry as provisional license holders following a detailed submission process. All four organisations will play a key role in the design and construction of the league's format moving forward, with the first meeting set to occur under Baseball Australia's direction this year.

"Baseball Victoria took on this opportunity to ensure Victorian women have a voice in shaping a professional women's league. This is the chance to explore what having a women's league could look like for Victoria, and what these possibilities could mean for our female athletes," Baseball Victoria CEO Kristie Middleton said.
