Genevieve Beacom recorded five strikeouts in her first pitching appearance, while Shae Lillywhite drove in two runs and Bronwyn Gell and Morgan Doty both collected a pair of hits for the Emeralds in the opening game. Beacom, Lillywhite, Gell and Doty are joined on the roster by fellow Victorians Gabby Bevan, Belinda Cannington, Brittney Cedelland, Sinead Flanigan, Abbey Kelly and Abbey McLellan. Grants of up to \$5,000 are available to increase the capacity of community sport and recreation organisations to deliver events that promote gender equality. In March 2019, Doncaster Dragons Baseball Club hosted Baseball and Beyond, a panel discussion on women's baseball and display of the women's state teams, made possible through the support of a Change Our Game Community Activation Grant.
