Baseball Victoria COVID-19 Update

Baseball Victoria continues to closely monitor the Victorian Government's announcements on the easing of coronavirus restrictions, and we expect to provide further clarification following this weekend's updates from Victorian Premier Daniel Andrews.

Currently, there are three VSBL clubs in regional Victoria that may register to return to training: Ballarat Royals, Geelong Baycats and Mitchell Majors. This is for contact and non-contact sport for regional Victorians aged 18 and under, as well as outdoor non-contact sport for adults.

This ability to train applies only to the Ballarat Royals, Geelong Baycats and Mitchell Majors as clubs participating in the Victorian Summer Baseball League. All players from these three clubs will be required to complete the return to training registration for regional Victoria, and all clubs must maintain an attendance register and COVID-19 restriction compliance documentation.

Registration and return to play documents have been confirmed directly with these clubs and any changes will be communicated accordingly, subject to updates from Sport and Recreation Victoria.

Baseball Victoria will provide further clarification on the easing of restrictions in regional Victoria and the plans for metropolitan Melbourne in line with updates from the Victorian Government.

Baseball Victoria is considering how clubs that traditionally play in winter and have been unable to conduct a season of baseball might be able to participate in a division of the Victorian Summer Baseball League for regional Victoria or how they might join the Victorian Summer Baseball League.

VicHealth Reimagining Health Grants

Applications are open for the VicHealth *Reimagining Health Grants*, a redesigned funding program offering \$2.5 million in grants for Victorian community organisations.

VicHealth has merged previous funding opportunities such as Active Club Grants and Partnership grants into this funding stream to simplify the process so organisations can get the support they need as soon as possible.

VicHealth is offering grants of up to \$3K, \$10K or \$50K for local organisations who can support young people (aged 0-25 years) or Victorians experiencing disadvantage, by creating meaningful social connection, providing opportunities for physical activity or by addressing food security issues.

Local sporting organisations and clubs are encouraged to view the <u>grant guidelines</u> and apply before applications close on Tuesday, 27 October at 11:59 PM. Early applications may be assessed and notified of the outcome prior to the closing date, so apply early for the fastest outcome.
