Baseball Victoria COVID-19 Update

Due to the current COVID climate around Australia with several states in lockdown, the Victorian Government announced this week that restrictions will remain at their current level with no changes until a further date.

In Victoria, the restrictions are:

- Players, parents, and spectators can attend outdoor community sport within the total cap of 1,000 people.
- Private visitors to the home increase to 15 and up to 50 people can gather outside in a public place like a park.
- Density limits increased in public settings including workplaces and restaurants, with masks still required indoors.

Community sport remains open for all ages both training and competition, within venue limits and subject to all COVIDSafe settings.

Local Sports Infrastructure Fund

Sport and Recreation Victoria recently announced 73 infrastructure projects that will receive a boost from the Victorian Government's Local Sports Infrastructure Fund, and two baseball venues are on the list. The Police Paddocks Softball & Baseball Batting Cage in Dandenong, home to South East Warriors, and Deep Creek Reserve, home to Doncaster Dragons, will be upgraded with successful funding applications under the Female-Friendly Facilities stream.

Get Active Kids Voucher Program

As a reminder, there is one week left to apply for the second round of funding through the Victorian Government's \$21 million Get Active Kids Voucher Program. The program offers vouchers to help eligible kids get involved in organised sport and recreation activities by providing up to \$200 towards the cost of membership and registration fees, sports equipment, or uniforms (new or second-hand).
