



SAMPLE PLAIN LANGUAGE

Plain language benefits several groups of people, such as people who have a learning disability, low literacy, or speak English as a second language.

To make information easier to understand, use the following:

- Make the font simple and bigger (size 18)
- Left orientation for whole page
- Simple, everyday words
- Make headings
- Use pictures that illustrate message
- “Thinking space” – make sure there is white space on the page so text is easy to follow
- Make sure all words aren't in capitals; only use correct capitalisation
- Use minimal punctuation
- Use bullet points to break up large amounts of text
- Avoid columns, use a single column of writing
